How it works

Bricks + Beers provide everything we need to run the event, including a pile of LEGO bricks, LEGO sets and prizes - all we need is a good bar, and space to play!

Payments can work 2 ways:

1. Builders pay a fee of £5 per person to cover my time and the prizes; there is no cost to the venue.
2. The venue can pay a fee to cover expenses, and either charge their own admission or run it as a free event and benefit from additional food/drink sales. From £125

Typical event format

Event timings are flexible; below gives you an idea of timings and duration for **Bricks + Beers** events.

- 19:00 Arrival**
Gives people a chance to arrive, chat, and order food & drink.
- 19:15 Challenges**
Challenge builds, with LEGO prizes for the winners.
- 20:15 Free build challenge**
The big prize: all builders are set a challenge to build a model on a given theme (e.g., local landmarks, spaceships, bridges, history). The best model as voted for by the builders wins a LEGO set prize.
- 21:00 Event ends**
At most events we're able to allow builders to continue playing with the LEGO bricks.
